**NEW BUSINESS:**

- Daryl Futhey made a motion that members recite the Pledge of Allegiance before the start of each meeting. Motion passed. A prayer was then led by member Gwen Hensley before the start of the July meeting.
- The front door of the Pleasant School has been found open on two separate occasions. No damage to the door or to the inside of the building was found. There was a discussion on moving a hidden key to the building in case someone had found it and was using it to unlock the door. However, the decision was made to wait and see if the door is found open again.
- There are carryover funds in the amount of \$48,200 from
- Brian Prentice, who did the sheet rock and insulation work in the museum building submitted a bid of \$6,500 to install vinyl flooring in the building.
- Concrete Coatings of Wichita was awarded the contract of installing new flooring in the museum building at a cost of \$7,000.
- Cindy Bradford reported that her family is purchasing a banner advertising the Tractor Pedal Pull event, which is fully sponsored by the RH Historical Society and will be held during the RH Fall Festival in October. The banner will be placed on the fence surrounding the RHHS football field.
- After the work on the museum building is completed, Janis Linot and Cindy Bradford discussed having an open house during the RH Fall Festival to show everyone all the work that has been done. An old fashion carnival with homemade games that would draw in more kids was suggested.
- A logo to represent the Rose Hill Historical Society was introduced and ideas were discussed.

- Member Gwen Hensley asked what the responsibilities of the three entities, the City of Rose Hill, the Rose Hill Middle School STUCO along with their advisor Debbie Funke and the Rose Hill Historical Society are regarding the Rose Hill Veterans Banners.
- Responsibilities of the City of Rose Hill are to provide the hardware (brackets) to hang the banners and they do this at their own expense. The City of Rose Hill displays banners before RHHS Graduation, around Memorial Day, and until after July 4<sup>th</sup> using a map provided by Debbie Funke and the Rose Hill Middle School STUCO. The banners are packed and stored at the new museum building in a locked container by City of Rose Hill employees.
- Several years ago, the Rose Hill Middle School STUCO, along with their advisor Debbie Funke, came up with the idea of honoring our veterans by selling banners that would display their pictures and the branch of the armed forces for who they served our country. Their responsibilities included selling the banners, contacting Evergy to obtain permission to use their electrical poles to display the banners, provide a map of where the banners are to be displayed to the City of Rose Hill and to give the money they collect from the selling of the banners to the Rose Hill Historical Society to place in a bank account which in turn would be used to pay for the banners to be made.
- The responsibility of the Rose Hill Historical Society is to place the monies received from the selling of the veterans' banners in an account and then paying the company who makes the banners.
